I note the May 21, 2010, announcement that the USPS Office of Inspector General will conduct an audit of postage workshare discounts.

As you are aware, the American Postal Workers Union has a long history of denouncing excessive discounts and pointing out that they fail to comply with federal law. We have engaged in numerous discussions of this subject with Congress, postal management, and your office.

Therefore, I was extremely disappointed that your announcement of the audit, which outlined plans to interview a range of "stakeholders," excluded postal unions from the consultative process.

I do not believe this was an oversight, since it followed so closely the May 12, 2010, House Subcommittee hearings on this subject, during which the union criticized postal management and your office for turning a blind eye to the abuses. The exclusion of the unions is magnified by your announced intent to interview mailers' representatives – who are the beneficiaries of the excessive discounts.

Despite my disappointment, I commend your office for undertaking this study. Given the loss of billions of dollars annually, this subject should have been reviewed long ago. "Universal service at uniform rates" is the linchpin of the American mail system, so the widespread, persistent deviation from this standard deserves your attention and demands correction.

I would be pleased to add my voice to your inquiries. However, whether or not our views are considered as part of your audit, we ask that you analyze the relative efficiencies of decentralized mail processing and transportation systems – which are encouraged by workshare discounts – as well as their impact on the USPS network, which is required to provide universal service for non-discounted mail.

I look forward to reviewing the final report.
