Dear Cliff:

As a follow up to the notice provided May 16, 2012 (enclosed) regarding the modified network consolidation plan for implementation of the decisions announced on February 22, 2012 (also enclosed), a decision has been made to advance the implementation of the sites on the enclosed list to 2013.

The reason for this change is that the Postal Service has identified the opportunity to accelerate the anticipated savings while still maintaining the interim SCF service standard. The Postal Service continues to face one of the most difficult challenges in its history. The current economic downturn and continued internet diversion has led to historically large deficits. As a result, the Postal Service is not receiving enough revenue to sustain the cost of its processing and delivery network.

It is projected that these consolidations will result in significant savings for the Postal Service. Some affected career employees may be reassigned to other vacant positions. Reassignments will be made in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement.

On February 22, the Postal Service informed the unions and management organizations of the decisions made regarding feasibility studies conducted at 252 mail processing sites. The following day, February 23, you were provided a detailed list of the sites identifying those approved for implementation, those that were disapproved, and those placed on hold.

You were informed in the February 22 notice that the implementation of operational consolidations was contingent upon the outcome of the pending rulemaking under which proposed revisions to existing delivery service standard regulations were being considered. In addition, in December 2011, the Postal Service voluntarily imposed a moratorium on closing or consolidating post offices and mail processing facilities prior to May 15, 2012.

The purpose of this notice is to inform you of the modified network consolidation plan for implementation of the decisions announced on February 22. Now that the moratorium has expired, consolidation activities will begin this summer. Following a break from September through December, for election and holiday mail seasons, the first phase will resume in January 2013. A second phase will then continue and be completed by the end of 2014.

A new, interim regulation to modify existing Service Standard for overnight delivery will be introduced. Final Rule will soon be published in the Federal Register that will shrink the geographic reach of overnight service to local areas. This new interim Service Standard will enable consolidating activity in 2013, and will be replaced with a permanent Service Standard for overnight delivery in 2014.

Enclosed are copies of employee stand up talks which will begin at the end of Tour 3 today. A listing of the sites and implementation schedule will be provided to you tomorrow, May 17, in advance of the public release.

It is projected that these consolidations will result in significant savings for the Postal Service. Some affected career employees may be reassigned to other vacant positions. Reassignments will be made in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement.

Dear Cliff,

On September 14, 2011, the Postal Service informed the unions and management organizations of its intent to conduct feasibility studies at 252 mail processing sites. You were provided a list of those sites as enclosures to the September 14 notice. The purpose of this notice is to inform you that decisions have been made based on those studies. A list of the study sites and the decisions made will be provided to you tomorrow, February 23, 2012, in advance of the public release. The list will include those studies that have been approved for implementation, those that were disapproved, and those that have been placed on hold. Due to the volume of data contained in each feasibility study, copies of the studies will not be available tomorrow, but will be hand delivered to you as soon as possible. Where the decision is to consolidate mail processing operations, implementation is subject to certain conditions as described below.

Implementation of the operational consolidations is contingent upon the outcome of the currently pending rulemaking under which proposed revisions to existing delivery service standard regulations are being considered. See 76 Fed. Reg. 77942 (December 15, 2011). If service standard changes are adopted, the consolidations, as outlined in the first that will be provided to you on February 23rd, will be implemented. In December 2011, the Postal Service agreed to impose a moratorium on closing or consolidating post offices and mail processing facilities prior to May 15, 2012, to give Congress and the Administration the opportunity to enact an alternative plan. This delay was designed to allow Congress sufficient time to enact comprehensive postal legislation. Therefore, any transfer of operations will not begin before May 15, 2012.

The Postal Service must continually look to improve productivity and increase efficiency while maintaining excellent service. The decline in mall volume and revenues due to the economic downtum has only heightened the need for such improvements. These consolidations will allow us to accomplish this goal by making better use of excess space, staffing, and equipment, and to process mail more efficiently.

It is projected that these consolidations will result in significant savings for the Postal Service. Some affected career employees may be reassigned to other vacant positions. Reassignments will be made in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement.
