2. Basis of the Charge (set forth a clear and concise statement of the facts constituting the alleged unfair labor practices)

Since on or about June 20, 2011, and continuing to date, the Postal Service has failed and refused to bargain in good faith with the American Postal Workers Union, AFL-CIO, by among other things, failing and refusing to provide relevant information necessary for collective bargaining and/or grievance processing including information concerning the Postal Service's closing and relocation of operations and the related AMP Feasibility Surveys and data.

First request was made by Greg Bell, APWU Executive Vice President, by letter dated May 10, 2011, to John Dockins, Manager, USPS Contract Administration. In response the parties met on June 2, 2011, during which Greg Bell clarified the information request. The Postal Service responded by letter dated June 20, 2011, from Patrick Devine, Acting Manager, USPS Contract Administration (APWU), denying the request. The Postal Service has not provided the requested information.

By the above and other acts, the above-named employer has interfered with, restrained, and coerced employees in the exercise of the rights guaranteed in Section 7 of the Act and the Postal Reorganization Act.
