Dear Mr. Lingberg:

On October 14, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management improperly sent the grievant for a fitness for duty examination involving a blood test and urinalysis.

Without prejudice to the position of either party we mutually agreed that in full resolution of this grievance all records of the grievant's medical examination including blood and urinalysis testing shall be expunded from U.S. Postal Service files.

It is understood and agreed that this settlement is made for the sole purpose of resolving this grievance and is considered non-citable regarding the future position of the parties concerning this issue or issues of a similar nature.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to settle this case.
