

On September 20, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.

question raised in this grievance involved whether the grievant was improperly denied LSM training.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. We agreed that there is no dispute between the parties at Step 4 relative to the vision requirements for LSM clerks that are contained in Qualification Standard No. 2315f. We also agreed that the standard does not contain provisions for a waiver.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.
