Dear Mr. Lingberg:

On July 23, 1986, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure. '

The issue in this grievance is entitlement to pay for travel within a 50-mile radius.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that the issue of what is a local commuting area is a noninterpretive issue and must be determined in each case based on the particular facts involved, including both whether the travel involved is within a distance of fifty miles and whether it is within the suburban area immediately surrounding the employee's duty station.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.

# INCREASES IN TRAVEL PER DIEM RATES

Effective November 6, 1986, per diem rates for authorized travel within the contiguous United States will be based on high cost or average cost locality quarterly per diem rates. The following key cities and/or areas are classified as high cost localities (all other cities are classified as average cost localities):

Handbook, F-10, Travel, Appendix P Rebursement Rates, Section II, Per Diem be modified as indicated below (there changes to Postal Service lodging policy):

#### H Lodging is Required

When the traveler is in a travel status and locing is required, per diem will be allowed at a resof \$8.25 per 6-hour segment or fraction there for travel to locations identified as high cost calities. Travel to all other localities will be peat a rate of \$7.00 per 6-hour segment or fractithereof. For segments where travel occurs with both high and average cost localities, the trave determines the per diem rate for the segments based upon where the majority of time was speduring that segment.

# If Lodging is not Required

When lodging is not required and the trave is in a travel status for more than 10 consecut. hours and less than 24 hours, per diem is allow at a rate of \$6.26 per 6-hour segment or fracts of it—based on the elapsed time. For example, a traveler departs from the official duty station 6:30 a.m. and returns at 6:10 p.m., the total time lapsed is 11 hours and 40 minutes. In this ple, the traveler will be entitled to two per per diem—for the one full 6-hour period fraction of a second 6 hour period (5 hours, minutes)—at the rate of \$6.25 per period.
