Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On May 21, 1981, we met with your representative to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question raised in this grievance is whether or not a Sorter Induction Accuracy Test (SIAT) was properly conducted. Specifically, the Union maintained that provisions of the M-49 Randbook were violated by conducting the test with the supervisor standing in a location where he did not have a clear view of the grievant and the supply of mail to the keyers.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no National interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The question as to whether or not the supervisor referred to in this case was positioned in a manner that would enable him to make observations in a given situation as required by the referenced handbook is a matter that should be determined locally.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if

necessary. Please sign a copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
