Dear Mr. Adams:

On September 7, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.


The questions raised in this grievance involved whether management is required to specify the amount of overtime to be worked, and whether proper notification was given prior to scheduling overtime.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no National interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. There is no dispute between the parties at the National level concerning the meaning and intent of Article 8.5.F. and that employees shall be afforded as much advance notice as possible when overtime is required.


Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.
