On September 27, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

This grievance involves the training time allowed for an LSM Clerk. The grievant reached 100% accuracy on new memory items within 50 minutes. The Union contends that he should have been given the remaining time, up to four hours, to practice on review deck cards.

After carefully considering all available information, it is the position of the Postal Service that a contractual violation did not occur in this case. Accordingly, the grievance is denied.
