
On September 17, 1979, we met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.

During our discussion, we mutually agreed that there is no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National Level as to the meaning and intent of Article XXXVII, Section 3.F.6, concerning the requirement of incidental typing for the position of Claims and Inquiry Clerk.

Accordingly, as further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further processing by the parties at that level based upon the fact circumstances involved.
