Dear Mr. Baldwin:

On June 16, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that there was no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the meaning and intent of Article 37 of the National Agreement, as it relates to filling preferred duty assignments where incidental typing is required.

Article 37, Section 3.F.6., states that "where incidental typing is required as part of a duty assignment, such requirement must be reasonably related to the efficient performance of the responsibilities of the job." It is understood that where a typing requirement is contractually proper, a senior bidder may be required to demonstrate his skill by passing an appropriate typing test, if he/she is not already on a typing register.

Whether or not, in this case, the typing requirement was reasonably related to the efficient performance of the job is a matter to be determined by examination of the local fact circumstances.

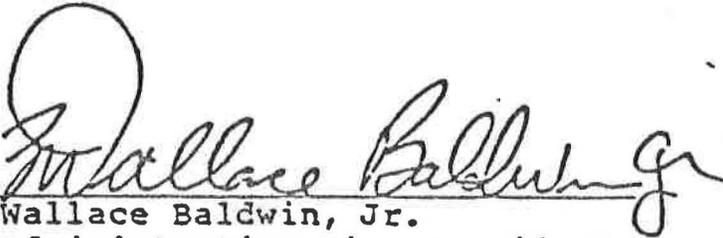
Accordingly, as further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to Step 3 for further processing by the parties at that level.
