Dear Mr. Tunstall:

On September 6, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the grievant, who is hearing impaired, was given appropriate on-the-job training (OJT) for the position of Mailing Requirements Clerk and whether the grievant was discriminated against by her OJT instructor.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Whether management violated Article 37, Section 3.F., of the National Agreement in this instance, is a matter suitable for regional determination. The issue of alleged discrimination is a nonintepretive issue to be resolved by full development of the specific fact circumstances in this case.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing including arbitration, if necessary.
