Dear Mr. Wilson:

On November 29, 1984, you met with Tom Lang to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management is properly training employees to perform duties at the Finance Cage.

During the discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent full settlement of this case:

In order to be accountable for USPS property, funds, and mail, employees assigned and responsible for the subject duties in the Finance Cage, should be provided PEDC training to meet the needs of that work. Accordingly, the grievant should be made whole for any monies he has remitted to the USPS as payment for the shortage, incurred at the Finance Cage, which precipitated this grievance.
