On May 20, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in these grievances is whether management violated Article 37.3.F.7. in awarding bid assignments after the original successful bidder had bid off or withdrawn from the subject positions.

Based on our discussion, we agreed to administratively close these cases. We further agreed that this action is without precedent and without prejudice to the position of either party, and may not be cited by either party in any future grievance, hearing, arbitration or for any other purpose whatsoever.
