Dear Mr. Wilson:

On September 5, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this case is whether management violated Article 37 by administering a Window Clerk examination 12 days after the grievant had completed training.

It was mutually agreed to remand this case to Step 3 for settlement as follows:


1. The Window Clerk examination is to be conducted on the last day of training. In the instant case, this did not happen.
2. If the grievant so desires, he will be allowed to retrain and take a timely examination. If he passes the examination, he will be placed in the next window clerk vacancy.
3. The grievant will have 30 days from the date of this settlement to advise the Postmaster, in writing, if he so desires to be trained as a window clerk.


