Dear Hr. Baldwin:

On June 16, 1982, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

We mutually agreed that there was no interpretive dispute between the parties at the National level as to the meaning and intent of Article XXXVII, of the National Agreement as it relates to the Window Service Training Program.

Management Instruction, EL-730-80-11, states the policy and provides guidelines and procedures for implementing and conducting the Standard Training Program for new Window Clerks. It is understood that areas designated for study must be conductive to learning, that necessary training materials will be available, and that the On-The-Job Training Instructor will be available to monitor the performance of the trainee and to answer questions.

Accordingly, as further agreed, this case is bereby remanded to Step 3 for further processing based upon the fact circumstances by the parties at that level.

The grievance, to the extent discussed above, is denied.
