Dear Mr. Wilson:

On September 23, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the grievant was improperly denied the position of Window Services Technician (PS-6).

After further review of this matter, we agreed that there was no national interpretive issue fairly presented as to the meaning and intent of Articles 19 and 37 of the National Agreement. This is a factual dispute over the application of both the qualification standard for the position of Window Services Technician and Section 525 of the P-11 Personnel Operations Handbook to the specific bidding cycle in this case.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to Step 3 for further consideration by the parties.

The parties are to determine if the grievant (R. Moore) performed duties while a General Clerk that were the same as Window Clerk duties which satisfied the experience requirements of Qualification Standard 2320a. In addition, official records available at the closing date of the disputed posting must have reflected this experience.
