Dear Mr. Anderson:

On October 28, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether the grievant was properly moved from his bid assignment to accommodate an employee in an overtime status.

The parties at this level agreed that employees called in to work overtime on their nonscheduled day are not contractually guaranteed that such assignment will be to their bid position.

Accordingly, we agreed to close this case at this step of the grievance procedure.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as acknowledgment of our agreement to close this grievance.


