Dear Mr. Ross:

On January 23, you and Thomas J. Valenti of my staff met and discussed the requirement to possess a Commercial Drivers License (CDL) as required by the Commercial Motor Vehicle Act. Commercial motor vehicle is defined as a vehicle:

- 0 with a gross vehicle weight rating GVWR of 26,001 pounds or more;
- o designed to transport more than 15 passengers (including the driver); or
- o transporting hazardous materials in such quantities that the vehicle must be placarded under the Hazardous Materials Transportation Regulations (49 CFR 383.5)

During the discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following represents those employees required to have a CDL license:

Tractor trailer operators, motor vehicle operators, mechanics who road test commercial vehicles or otherwise operate commercial vehicles on postal property and operators of spotters and yard hustlers are required to have a CDL (Per Postal Bulletin number 21803, dated November 28, 1991).

All other employees (i.e., body and fender repairman, painters, etc.) are not required to maintain a CDL except in those situations where the installation has determined that (in the performance of their duties) they will drive a commercial vehicle off postal property. Additionally, these employees (while in the performance of their duties) will continue (as they have in the past) to drive all types of vehicles on the postal property.

- The Commercial Drivers License expense is paid by the employee.
- 4) The union will not pursue reimbursement of employees in the above categories who were required to obtain a CDL, but because of this agreement are no longer required.
